John Holenko has performed Classical, Celtic, blues and folk music on nylon and steel-string guitar, mandolin, banjo and historic instruments throughout the United States and in Europe. Called "a skilled soloist" by the Boston Globe, Mr. Holenko has given recitals and been featured in radio broadcasts in New York, Los Angeles, Boston, and San Francisco. As a member of the of the early music ensemble Sonus, Mr. Holenko has performed on historic instruments in recitals here in the United States and in Europe. John Holenko performs on mandolin and steel-string guitar with his group The Hungry Monks, an eclectic, acoustic ensemble playing a wide variety of traditional and original music. John Holenko has been on the faculty of Charleston Southern University and The College of Charleston. He is also the Guitarist, Mandolinist, and Banjo player

for the Charleston Symphony Orchestra. Mr. Holenko is very active in music education through his own private studio, Hungry Monk Music, and residencies through the South Carolina Arts Commission. John has been an instructor in music at the Charlotte Children's Theatre in Charlotte, NC, and at the Cuyahoga Valley Environmental Education Center in Ohio, where he has also been Artist-in Residence. Mel Bay Publications has published editions of Medieval music and Renaissance music for mandolin by Mr. Holenko. John Holenko received degrees in Classical Guitar performance from the New England Conservatory, and the University of Southern California, also studying historic performance at both institutions, and premiering many new works.

Hazel Ketchum plays many instruments and sings. Hazel is best known as a lute player, singer, and member of the early music group Sonus. They have three CD's released on a major label with great reviews and all the glory that comes with being a medieval musician. Hazel plays for children quite bit these days because she wants an audience that sings and claps along and occasionally has chocolate donut icing on their face. Hazel teaches piano, guitar, voice and songwriting. In the summers you might find Hazel in the Cuyahoga National Park in Ohio where she has been Artist in Residence, or in Little Rock, AR teaching and performing Celtic music, or playing coffee houses up and down the East Coast. Hazel plays concerts for campers, formal house concerts, outdoor concerts and at the train stations. Hazel has recorded a Family CD called "Big As The World" that features traditional and original songs. Joining her on this CD are her daughter Althea (6 years old at the time) and several of Althea's friends who went to the same Montessori School when they were little so we call them the Palmetto Montessori Singers. Hazel sings and plays guitar in the Hungry Monks which have recorded several CD's including Organic Tangerines and All Through the Night. Hazel has been a member of the Donnybrook Legacy and Marsh Grass Mamas.
